prefix	root	word	literal meaning	definition
re (back)	ject (throw)	reject (v)	throw back	refuse to accept something or someone
con (with)	ject (throw)	conjecture (n)	throw together	a guess based on incomplete information
inter (between)	ject (throw)	interject (v)	throw in between	interrupt
ob (against)	ject (throw)	object (v)	throw against	oppose or disagree with something
de (down)	ject (throw)	dejected (adj)	throw down	sad, depressed, feeling down
in (into)	ject (throw)	inject (v)	throw into	force fluid into (like an injection), introduce something new forcefully
pro (before)	ject (throw)	project (v)	throw forward	forecast, throw forward (project your voice)
sub (under)	ject (throw)	subject (v)	throw under	bring under control, force someone to have an unpleasant experience
ab (off/away)	ject (throw)	abject (adj)	thrown away, degraded	sunk to low state or condition, very bad or severe
